








2020 ORCID BOARD ELECTIONS

ORCID is looking for new Board members to support us as we transition from a start-up to a more mature, sustainable organization.

 - Applications from diverse candidates based on gender and ethnic origin






THE 2020 SLATE

October 23 - November 22: Online voting open

November 22: Virtual members meeting to finalize and announce election results





ORCID IN ASIA PACIFIC

- 106 active integrations
- **4.6M** total Registry users in 2019 (through end September)
 - +60% compared with same period in 2018
- 144 members in APAC
 - +8% (133 in 2017)
- Four consortia: Australia, New Zealand, Taiwan, Japan (planning)
