WHAT IS ORCID?

- A Registry of persistent identifiers for researchers (ORCID iDs)
- iDs are global, interdisciplinary, free for individuals
- Open, not-for-profit membership organization
- Guided by principles of privacy and researcher control


WHAT IS ORCID-CA?

ORCID-CA (orcid-ca.org) is the Canadian ORCID Consortium, developing and supporting a community of practice for not-for-profit research organizations in Canada.

RESEARCHER BENEFITS

- ORCID iDs are free for researchers
- Researchers own and control their record
- Researchers use the same iD throughout their career, wherever they work and whatever name(s) they use
- Using an iD increases recognition for their work and contributions
- ORCID is embedded in key research workflows from grant application to manuscript submission and beyond
- Records can be automatically updated by trusted organizations

UBC: EXAMPLE OF RESEARCH EXPERTISE MANAGEMENT




- Canadian consortium member
- But: non-integrated systems
- Re-entry of the same data into multiple applications
- Inefficient: time loss and frustration for researchers
- Data inconsistencies
- Limited analytical capabilities
