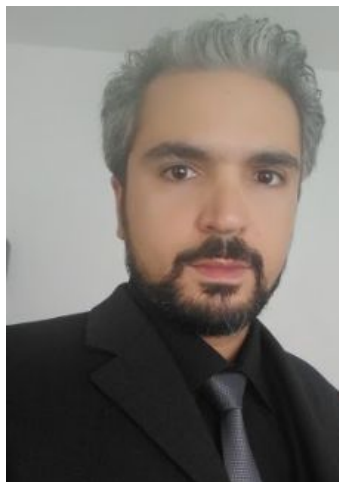

ORCID's vision is a world where all who participate in research, scholarship, and innovation are uniquely identified and connected to their contributions across disciplines, borders, and time.



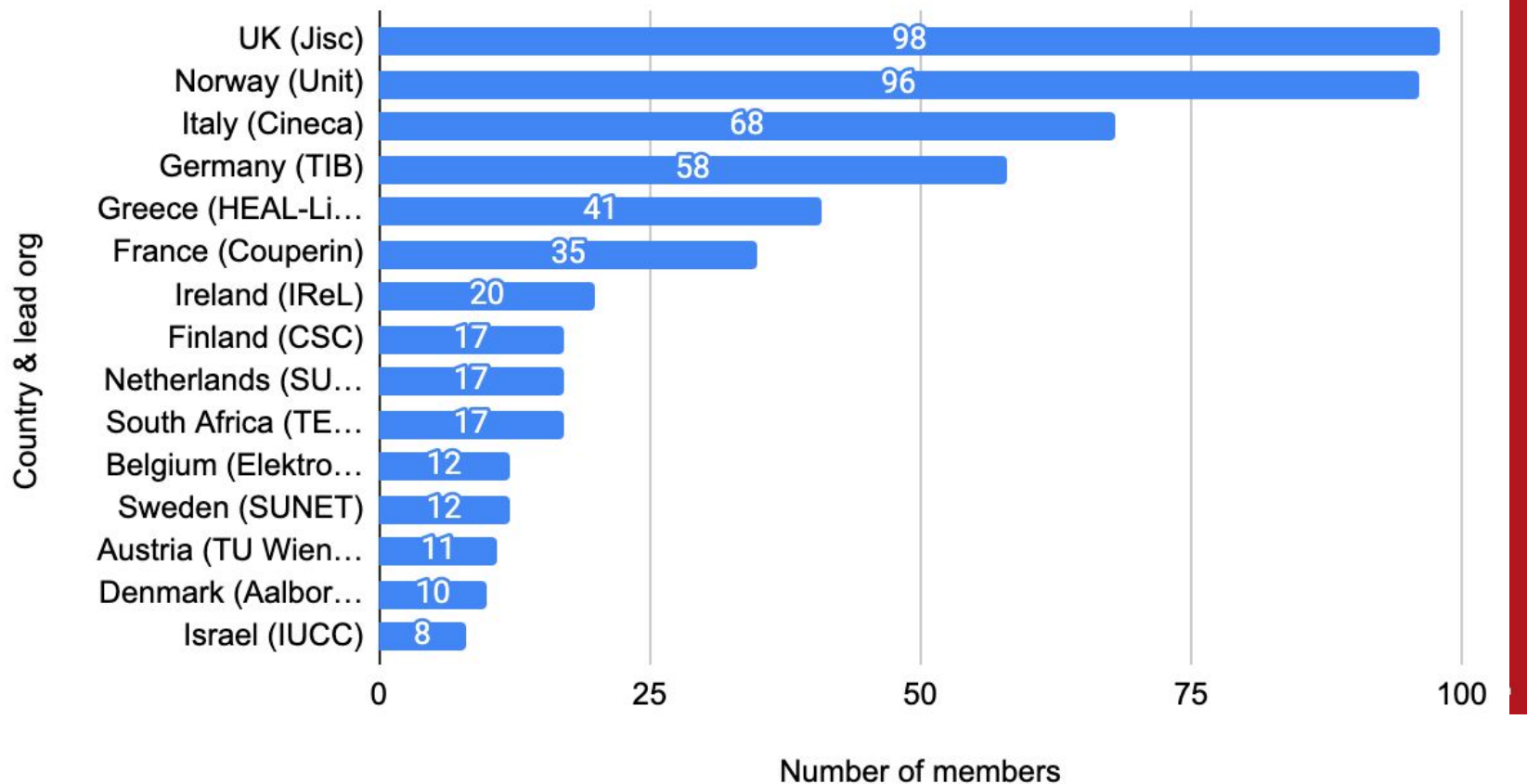

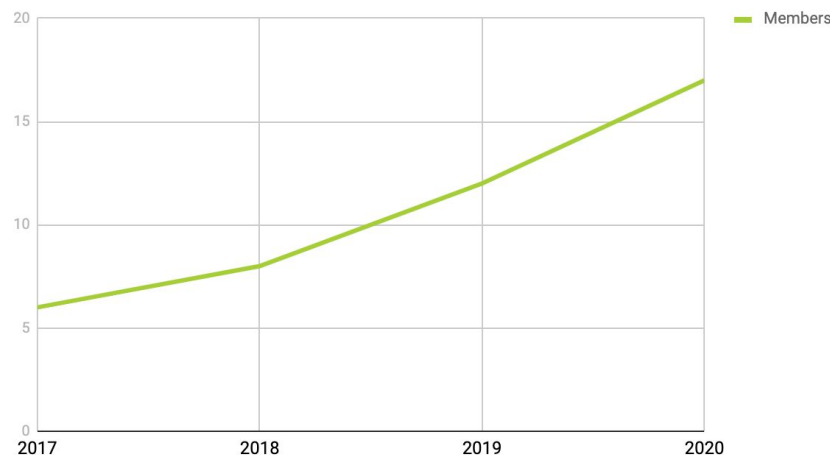

NRF ORCID Statement

The NRF requires that all researchers and students applying for funding and rating at the NRF have an ORCID* identifier.

The NRF is in the process of integrating the ORCID identifier into all application and grant management business processes and systems and will allow researchers to include their ORCID identifier when updating their CVs. The NRF is also considering the downstream integration benefits to both researchers and the NRF including automated processes for uploading research output records into a researcher's profile and annual research reports.

A unique identifier, as provided by ORCID and which researchers can associate with their name variations and their research works, is a way to ensure that these links can be made accurately and reliably. This will help researchers to uniquely identify themselves as the author of their work across all systems integrated with the ORCID registry.

The NRF membership of ORCID ensures that researchers and their institutions will benefit from access to and integration with the ORCID registry, including setting up and maintaining disambiguated records for all researchers and linking these to their publications and other research outputs, leading, in turn, to a simpler, more reliable evaluation process.

** ORCID is an international, interdisciplinary, open and not-for-profit organisation created in 2010 for the benefit of all stakeholders, including research organisations, research funders, publishers and researchers. We aim to transform the research ecosystem by providing a registry of persistent unique identifiers for researchers and scholars and automating linkages to research objects such as publications, grants and patents (www.orcid.org)*

Create or Connect your ORCID iD

You are invited to create your ORCID iD and connect it with your Stellenbosch University unique identifier. Please click on the button below. If you already have an ORCID iD, please sign in to your account from the button below and connect your iD with your SU iD. (It is advised to use your sun.ac.za e-mail address to create your iD)

Central to the NWU-ORCID integration is the NWU Manuscript system which was created to facilitate creating (new) or linking (existing) ORCID iDs while at the same time granting the NWU permission to push updates to the individuals' ORCID record.

Integration the NWU Institutional Repository (NWU-IR) was used. Items uploaded to the NWU-IR are automatically pushed to the author(s) of the output.

University of the Free State supports and advocates the use of ORCID. The UFS is now also making it possible for you to easily share your research information and keep it up to date. With your permission, we will synchronize information between RIMS and your ORCID record.

If you haven't yet registered, you can register for an ORCID iD on RIMS:

1. Go to [RIMS](#).
2. Log in using your Kopsie credentials.
3. Go to your profile and click on the ORCID link.
4. Register on the ORCID website. You will now have the opportunity to grant the UFS permission to access your ORCID iD.
