







WHAT IS ORCID? ORCID IS NOT A TRADITIONAL VENDOR




- ORCID provides a disambiguative ID for researchers for free
- ORCID maintains a registry of these IDs and supports reliable, researcher-controlled connections with other research systems
- ORCID is supports this registry through membership by funders, publishers, universities and service providers
- ORCID members choose and maintain their systems' connections to the registry according to ORCID best practices

THE ORCID REGISTRY: A SNAPSHOT

- 9,373,654 ORCID Records (IDs)
- an average of 20-40,000 created per week
- 60,024,763 works
- 883,583 funding items
- 2,530,692 peer review items
- 4,384,691 education affiliations
- 4,464,121 employment affiliations
- 1153 member institutions
- 23 national consortia








INTEROPERABILITY

ORCID is researcher-based and a primary focus is user control of all of their information about their research activities and affiliations

We aim to connect these activities and affiliations through trusted connections, and display the provenence of these trusted assertions through our API tool.




ORCID connects your review activity



Contributor roles via ORCID now






ORCID is working towards enabling selecting CRediT contribution roles

Key Milestones Achieved in CRediT-NISO Collaboration

Baltimore, MD - July 23, 2020 - Following their April 2020 <u>announcement</u>, the <u>National Information Standards Organization (NISO)</u> and the <u>Contributor Roles Taxonomy (CRediT)</u> Steering Committee have now achieved two more important milestones in their work to formalize and develop CRediT both as a NISO/ANSI standard and as a community.

In short time, NISO and the <u>CRediT Steering Committee</u> collaborated to establish a <u>small initial</u> <u>working group</u>, which expects to complete editorial changes to the taxonomy language and submit the draft for final approval in September. In addition, they have launched a new, information-rich website http://credit.niso.org, to replace the prior version, which has now been sunset. And, to help further engage the community, a CRediT Twitter account has also been created — <u>@contributor roles</u>.

"With NISO's strong support and adept project management, our team has been able to accelerate the pace of our work to share CRediT with the community – to make it as usable and useful as possible," commented Liz Allen, Director of Strategic Initiatives at F1000, one of the Taxonomy's originators, and current Steering Committee member. "We look forward to full standardization and the standard sta
