Background

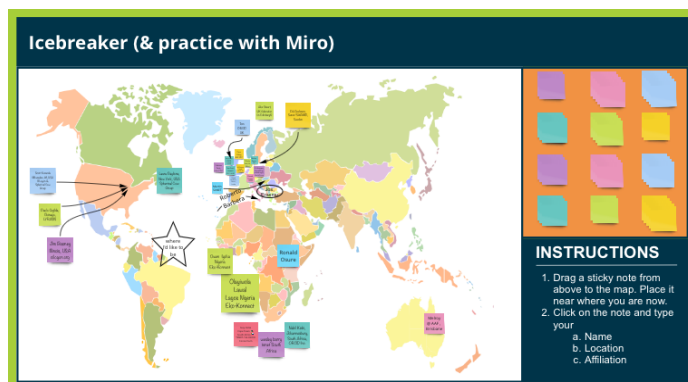
Collaboration between ORCID and the research/education community has grown since ORCID's launch in late 2012:

- Federations lead ORCID consortia of institutions
- Academic libraries rely on ORCID iDs to attribute, catalog and quantify scholarly communications outputs
- Research institutions use ORCID iDs to more accurately link research contributors
- ORCID sign-in has been considered as an IdP of Last Resort for research collaboration tools
- Unique Institutional credentials have been linked to over 320,000 ORCID accounts
- ORCID iDs are included in the eduPerson schema

Conversations happen globally among ORCID, federation operators, library and research organizations, practitioners, software providers, and standards committees, though rarely over the entirety of this group at the same time. During this meeting, we convene to consider strategic topics that involve the ORCID platform or iDs, and deepen collaboration among the ORCID and these communities.

We had nearly 50 attendees from many regions of the world:

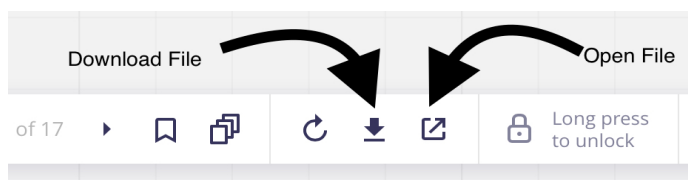


Notes

Inspiration: The Role of ORCID in Connection & Collaboration

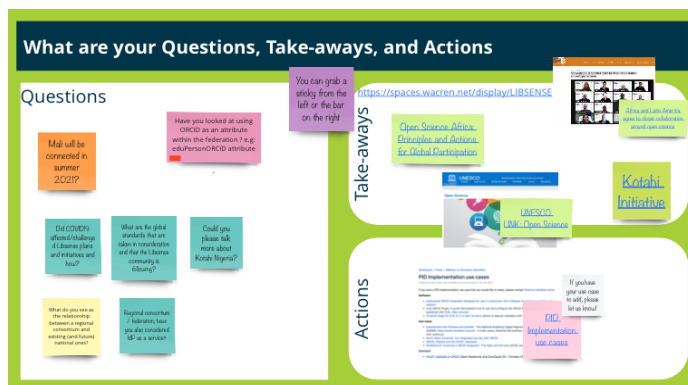

Omo Oaiya started and leads the LIBSENSE initiative, a collaboration of the regional African RENs (ASREN, Ubuntunet Alliance & WACREN), constituent national RENs and national library consortia building communities of practice and strengthening local and national

services to support open science and research in Africa. The overriding vision of the LIBSENSE initiative is to support open science, which is seen as the next level for knowledge production in the Academy. The idea is that with no reliable built infrastructure already in place, the adoption of new infrastructure can be a catalyst for newer services supported by that newer infrastructure. The reach of work is extended with the April 2021 announcement that LA Referencia, RedCLARA and the three African regional research and education networks – ASREN, WACREN and UbuntuNet Alliance – signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to formalize their relationship as the two continents seek to ramp up their open science activities.

The ORCID platform has been designed to facilitate connections between researchers and their research. Through authoritative assertions by member organizations, individuals may leverage the ORCID platform to communicate their research contributions through their ORCID records. NRENS and Access Federations have been instrumental in facilitating this work, at times creating specific tools to facilitate ORCID implementation. In addition, federated identity accounts have been linked to over 320,000 ORCID records, an impressive number, but only a small fraction of the over 11 million ORCID iDs. How can these connections

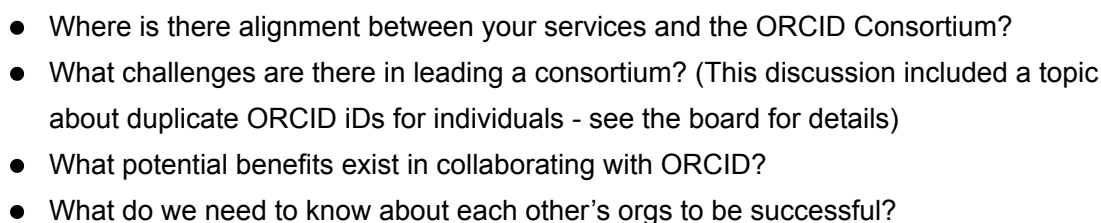
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- ## ORCID Network

The community that we build to enable global research and education can be as important as the tools. Federations, NRENS, and other collaborations have partnered with ORCID worldwide as part of their efforts to leverage unique identification of individuals and facilitate research and education information sharing across and within agencies. Included in this group are European Open Science Cloud (EOSC) research collaborations (eduTEAMS, EGI Check-in, B2ACCESS, Indigo IAM - European Open Science Cloud), FIM projects (SIRTFI, IoLR, etc). Federations and NRENS as ORCID Consortium leads.
