

IDENTIFIERS HELP TO MAKE THE WHOLE RESEARCH PROCESS TRANSPARENT







Register for ORCID | Share ORCID when making contributions | Manage share settings



Organization

Collect ORCID and read/ update permissions | Store with contribution in local database | Connect validated information with ORCID record-holder | Collect validated information from other organizations



Store validated connections between ORCID and connected resolvable identifiers | Make available via API






ORCID IS A COMMUNITY


- Over 3.2 million researchers

Over 3000 journals collect ORCID iDs from authors, including requirements by 27 publishers such as the American Chemical Society, American Geophysical Union, eLIFE, EMBO, IEEE, PLOS, Royal Society, Royal Society of Chemistry, Science, and Wiley.





BOOK PUBLISHER SURVEY (IN PROGRESS)

- Better metadata
 - Person disambiguation
 - Cross linking material
- Single sign-on
- Researching contributors in proposals
 - Save time for individuals
 - More info than traditional CV

INTEGRATION PROCESS

Technically, integrating ORCID involves adding <person ID> and <source> fields to data models, mapping to the ORCID API, and implementing OAuth and RESTful calls.
